Mennonite Women Canada Annual Report ~ March 2014

Mennonite Women Canada encourages women to:

- ~ nurture their life in Christ
- ~ acknowledge and share their gifts
- ~ hear and support each other
- ~ serve and minister across the street and around the world

Mennonite Women Canada has a 62-year history of coordinating the women's ministry of the 5 area churches of Mennonite Church Canada. We are a place where women can connect nationally and our projects continue to provide encouragement and support to women at home and overseas.

Our mission statement (above) is our compass in deciding which projects to support and we believe that our projects are consistent with it. Even so there are still details that change within each project from year to year.

Spiritual Growth Assistance Fund – Every year we offer scholarships to women studying Anabaptist theology at a Masters degree level. Recipients this year are Iris Leung (Trinity Western University), Melody-Neufeld Rocheleau (CMU), and Jessica Reesor- McDowell (Toronto School of Theology).

Pennies and Prayer Legacy Fund – \$5,000 from this endowment fund is used each year to support Witness workers overseas. Recipients are Christina and Darnell Barkman (Philippines) and Taryn and Nathan Dirks (Botswana).

Annual Bible Study Guide – We collaborate with Mennonite Women USA and MennoMedia to publish a 70-page Bible Study Guide. Courageous Women of the Bible was published in July 2013 and we sent 237 copies to MC Canada congregations and women's groups. The 2014 guide is called Practicing Presence and will be available this July. Every third year we invite a Canadian woman to be the writer.

International Ministries – With the guidance of Witness Council staff we choose an international project to support. This year we are continuing to support MC Canada's ongoing ministry among the Isaan people in northeast Thailand under the direction of recently installed Witness workers, Tom and Christine Poovong.

Radical Journey – This past year we continued to support this one-year program, a joint ministry between Mennonite Church USA and Mennonite Church Canada, which provides a one year cross-cultural experience for young adults.

Our biggest challenge and also our focus continue to center on making connections and communicating with women across Canada. As an executive we communicate almost exclusively by email. Our spring and fall *Connections* newsletter is available to churches across Canada both electronically and in hard copy. We continue to work on creating a national database of women wanting to stay connected to MW Canada. Articles for our page in the Canadian Mennonite under the by-line "Women Walking Together in Faith" are published every other month. We also post links to Connections and these articles on our blog.

A highlight for me this fall was being able to attend the BC Women's Ministry Fall Retreat at Camp Squeah. I was inspired by the speaker, Rebecca Seiling, and met and enjoyed the company of many wonderful women. I was also encouraged by their support of MW Canada.

Our finances are in the capable hands of Lois Mierau and she ends her second 3-year term in July 2016. As president, my 3-year term is ending this July and I have agreed to stay on for 2 more years. With the change from annual to biennial assemblies we are proposing a change to our constitution so that terms of office will be 2 years instead of 3 years. Each year we compile an Annual Report Book with financial statements and detailed descriptions of our projects, which is distributed to churches and women's groups across Canada. It is also available upon request.

MW Canada started blogging in January 2009 and ventured into Facebook in March 2013. We are encouraged by the number of visitors to both our blog and Facebook page as we to strive to make our posts relevant, informative and interesting. Visitors to our blog come from 71 different countries.

Once again we had a busy year in 2013 filled with meetings to provide 2 events that the women would hopefully enjoy!

First....

Inspirational Day - May 4th, 2013 at Eben-Ezer Mennonite Church in Abbotsford,

- 133 women attended and we provided childcare for 6 children.

- 44 evaluations were handed in – some loved the new format others not so much. This is normal and to be expected but at least we can say that we gave it a try.

- 13 MCBC churches were represented and 11 guest churches.

- Our offering totalled \$3,535.00 with half going to Camp Squeah, one quarter to Mennonite Women Canada International Ministries and one quarter to the Youth Unlimited.
- We also raised more funds by having fun with the first ever 'cake walk' at the Inspirational Day as well as hosting 'Ten Thousand Villages'. Will we do this again? Not sure! Still discussing it!
- Childcare and a workshop for the women were also on a first time trial run. Both were really appreciated.

WMCEC Interim Co-Coordinators Annual Report 2013

Women of Mennonite Church Eastern Canada met for our *Spring Enrichment Day* on April 20, 2013 at Tavistock Mennonite Church with 311 women attending. Terri J. Plank Brenneman from Goshen, Indiana was our guest speaker. She is the author of *Wonderfully Made: Women, Faith and Self-Care*, the 2011 Bible Study Guide of Mennonite Women USA and Mennonite Women Canada.

Terri divided her topic into two sessions: 1) Remembering God's Story, 2) Remembering Our Story. Her message began with a reminder that we are the resource for the world. Each of us is uniquely qualified to touch specific lives. "Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. Love your God with heart, soul and strength!" was the mantra for the morning. The afternoon session's mantra changed to "Hear, O Women of Mennonite Church Eastern Canada! Love the Lord your God with all your heart, your soul, your strength. Learn to love your neighbours and yourself. Trust in God's plan for you and your uniqueness!" Terri reminded us to embrace our own legacy and to tell others our faith stories. "Close Connection," a ladies trio from Tavistock, brought the special music for the day.

There was no fall event planned for this year but we encouraged clusters to have a meeting or event in their local area. Since we usually lifted an offering at our fall meetings, we wondered if we would receive enough funds to meet our budget. We are pleased to report that our budget of \$32,000 was met for 2013. We want to thank you for your continued support and for those clusters that lifted an offering in support of our WMCEC projects.

This has been a year of transition with three new people joining the WMCEC Executive: Linda Wiens, Communicator; Marie Assad, Personnel Coordinator; Dorothy Hamm, Program Coordinator. Kathryn Good and Florence Jantzi served as Interim Co-Coordinators and Lisa Blackburn as Treasurer. We are pleased that Phyllis Ramer from Zurich has consented to be our new Coordinator, beginning April 2014.

As we look ahead to 2014, we anticipate the following activities:

- Spring Enrichment Day, April 12: Faith, Food and Friends with special guest Bev Klassen, one of the authors of Mennonite Girls Can Cook, at St. Catharines United Mennonite Church.
- *Tulip Festival 2014*, May 2-4: A bus trip to Ottawa to enjoy the beautiful display of colours, tour the Parliament buildings and develop friendships with ladies at Ottawa Mennonite Church.
- Sister Care, October 3-4: This seminar validates women's gifts of caring and equips them to respond
 more effectively and confidently to the needs of others in their lives and in the congregation. This MW
 USA sponsored program has been shared globally and will be introduced in Ontario this October.

We give thanks to God for the many ways you are sharing your gifts in service to others. The WMCEC Executive and Committees appreciate your prayers as they continue with plans for activities in 2014.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH ASSISTANCE FUND

The Spiritual Growth Assistance Fund (SGAF) assists women with the costs of academic and/or applied study at the Master's level in church related ministries (such as seminary, theology, peace and conflict resolution). Members of a congregation belonging to Mennonite Church Canada are eligible to apply. Funding may be



granted for part of the tuition costs (payable to the institution) at the discretion of the executive of MW Canada. First time applicants are given priority, but applications for continuing support are also considered. The deadline for applications every year is June 30.



Annual Bible Study Guide




Since 1992 Mennonite Women Canada (MW Canada) together with Mennonite Women USA (MWUSA) has published an annual Bible Study Guide (BSG). Comprised of 12 or 13 lessons the guide is recommended for use in women's groups, Sunday School classes and for personal meditation. Every third year the writer is a Canadian woman. In July of each year a complementary BSG is sent to each MC Canada church across Canada and to the executives of the area church women's organizations. The 2013 BSG is called *Courageous Women of the Bible* authored by Linda Gehman Peachey. 237 Complementary copies were mailed out.

Additional BSG's are available through MC Canada's Resource Centre in Winnipeg at

http://resources.mennonitechurch.ca/ and MennoMedia at http://www.mennomedia.org/ at a cost of approximately \$10.00. We have some back copies of older BSG'S and they are available for \$5.00 each through the President at presmwcanada@mennonitechurch.ca.

The 2014 BSG will be available in July and is called *Practicing Presence*, authored by Terri J. Plank Brenneman. *Practicing Presence* is a women's Bible study guide that uses biblical characters to demonstrate how women can be a companioning presence with each other. Being present and caring for one another during times of need, or in the daily tasks of life, is an important practice of spiritual journeys.



PENNIES PRAYER



PENNIES AND PRAYER LEGACY FUND

This endowment fund had its roots in a project begun by General Conference women's groups in the US and Canada in 1935. Women were invited to contribute "two Pennies and a prayer" which was directed to the needs of returning missionaries. In 1957 this Missionary Pension Fund officially became a Canadian Women in Mission (CWM) project and the fund continued to grow.

In 2003 when the General Conference separated into two national conferences, the respective women's organizations also separated into two separate entities – Mennonite Women USA and Canadian Women in Mission, renamed Mennonite Women Canada in 2010. At that time the Missionary Pension Fund was divided proportionately with the Canadian group receiving about 30% of the funds or \$70,000.

Each year up to \$5000 in interest and principal is used to support two programs of Mennonite Church Canada that involve women. Currently we are connecting with Darnell & Christina Barkman (Philippines) and Nathan & Taryn Dirks (Botswana) and helping to support them through MC Canada's Witness program.

Mennonite Women Canada Minutes of the 60th Anniversary Luncheon & Annual Meeting Saturday, July 14, 2012 Sheraton Airport Hotel Vancouver, BC 12 noon

- Welcome and Lunch. Waltrude Gortzen, MCBC Women's Ministry representative, welcomed the 130 guests to the 60th anniversary luncheon and annual meeting. The Worship Team led us in singing *Praise God from whom all blessings flow* and we enjoyed a lovely catered meal—salad, chicken, rice pilaf, vegetables and strawberry tarts.
- 2. Introduction of MW Canada Executive. Liz Koop, MW Canada President, introduced the executive members.
- 3. Introduction of Special Guests. Liz Koop introduced special guests attending: Tim Froese, MC Canada Witness Executive Minister; Karen Martens-Zimmerly, Denominational Minister; Deborah Froese, Director of News Services, MC Canada; Melissa Miller, MennoMedia board chair; Amy Dueckman, Canadian Mennonite BC correspondent and our photographer for the day; Dori Zerbe Cornelsen, Mennonite Foundation; Marguerite Jack, Task Force Chair; Valeria Silva, visiting from Recife, Brazil; Worship Team (names listed in bulletin); Mennonite Girls Can Cook (names listed in bulletin). Waltrude introduced former BC Women in Mission Presidents present at our celebration Susan Kehler, Marie Rehsler, Helga Rempel, Veronica Thiessen,
- 4. Worship Singing and Stories from God's Kingdom. The Worship Team led us in singing Seeds, Scattered and Sown and Shine Jesus Shine. Carol Penner from Vineland, Ontario joined the executive in reading "Stories from God's Kingdom", eight historical vignettes written by Naomi Unger from Rabbit Lake, Saskatchewan. Carol tied the vignettes together with a litany reading using the theme verses taken from Mark 4:26-29.

5. Sharing.

- Tim Froese, Executive Minister for Witness Council extended words of greeting, thanking the women for their financial support over the years and blessing them for their work. He also gave strong encouragement to seek ways to connect inter-generationally and inter-culturally in this "new season".
- Valeria Silva, a woman pastor from Recife, Brazil, shared how the leading of God's spirit through events over the 60 years of Mennonite Women Canada's history encourages her in her ministry with Latin American Mennonite women studying Theology together.
- Several women shared during the open mike sharing session. Some had been supported in mission work overseas in the past by Mennonite Women Canada (then called Canadian Women in Mission) through funding but also with letters, cards and gifts which were really appreciated while they were far away from home and feeling lonely. One woman who is part of a Spanish ethnic church in BC challenged us to seek ways to include immigrant women. Several past presidents (national and provincial) also spoke.
- 6. Offering. Lois Mierau explained that the offering will be divided equally between a project chosen by the hosting province and one chosen by the executive. MCBC Women's Ministry has chosen their Retreat Bursary from which they subsidize women who need a bit of financial assistance in order to come to their Annual Fall Retreat at Camp Squeah. The

executive has chosen the MC Canada Youth Assembly Bursary Project which will subsidize and enable youth to attend the 2013 Youth Assembly at Camp Assiniboia in Manitoba. Cheques are to be made payable to MC Canada with MW Canada in the memo line. The Worship Team sang while the offering was taken and Lois Mierau led in prayer.

7. **President's Report.** Liz Koop highlighted portions of her written report (p. 5 in the report book). Copies of the report book were on every table.

8. Proposed Constitutional Revisions.

- Copies of the constitution with proposed changes as marked were on the tables.
- The constitution was last updated at the annual meeting in Calgary in 2010. The executive felt there were further updates required to bring the constitution in line with present practice, so the proposed revisions were brought to the annual meeting for ratification.
- Beginning on the first page, #2 "Mission Statement"—the four points in italics have been used in various brochures, on the website, etc. since they were first recommended by the Task Force, so the executive felt they should be included in the constitution.
- Moving to #3 "Membership"—we have no longer been using the criteria that a woman must be a member of a woman's organization to be a member of MW Canada.
- On page 2, #6B "Voting" for the past several years we have not appointed delegates to vote at the annual meeting. Anyone present at the annual meeting has been eligible to vote, so this wording reflects what is presently being practised.
- The remaining proposals are wording changes to reflect current terminology.
- Waltrude Gortzen/Eugenia Fernandez moved/seconded the adoption of the proposed changes to the constitution as proposed. Carried,

9. Financial Reports for 2011-2012.

- Lois Mierau presented the financial reports as printed in the Annual Report Book. The fiscal year ending January 31, 2012 was a "break-even" year, with receipts coming in very close to what had been budgeted, and expenses being very close to that as well. The excess of receipts over disbursements was close to zero-minus \$52.82.
- Total receipts for the 5 budget items was \$29,544.25 of a \$36,000 budget (79%), which is up by about \$1000 over the previous year's receipts (\$28,558.00).
- Pennies & Prayer Inheritance Fund payout. The executive has chosen two new MC Canada Witness projects beginning January 2013. They are: Christina and Darnell Barkman, who with their sons Cody and Makai from Abbotsford BC, have accepted an invitation to help lead a church planting ministry in Metro Manila, Philippines. The Barkmans seek to develop a new church in Manila as an outreach of the Integrated Mennonite Churches (IMC) of the Philippines. The Barkmans participated in the 2011 Mission Seminar and their assignment began April 1, 2012, with Canadian ministry, and arrived in the Philippines on June 8. They previously did a 10-month intern assignment in the Philippines in 2008. Nathan and Taryn Dirks from Niagara-on-the Lake, ON will work together with African Initiated Church (AIC) leaders and the Kgologano College Faculty Team at developing an AIC Centre in the city of Gaborone, Botswana. They will also teach Bible courses at the college and develop relationships with the local AIC congregations. This work builds on decades of earlier Mennonite ministry of Bible teaching with various AICs in northern Botswana. Their assignment begins with Mission Seminar in July 2012. They depart for Botswana in the fall of 2012.
- Lois Mierau/Shirley Hsu moved/seconded the adoption of the Statement of Receipts and Disbursements for the year ended January 31, 2012 as presented. Carried.

- 10. Proposed Opportunities for Giving February 1, 2013 to September 30, 2013.
 - MC Canada is moving toward a fiscal year ending September 30, so we will also be ending our fiscal year on that date. Next year (2013) will be a short year of only 8 months and because a major amount of our funds are received in the fall, before Christmas, the executive is proposing that our budget projections be reduced by one-half for this shorter fiscal year. The total proposed amount is \$18,000; no changes have been made to the categories.
 - The executive will, in consultation with MC Canada Witness, determine the specific International Ministries project for the coming fiscal year.
 - Because MC Canada Assemblies will be held biennially instead of annually from now on, MW Canada will also be meeting every other year. We have been advised by MC Canada staff that the executive has the legal power to approve the budget in years when there is no Assembly. Financial statements and budgets need to be distributed in some way during those years as they will still be generated on an annual basis. More details are expected sometime this fall.
 - Lois Mierau/Waltrude Gortzen moved/seconded the adoption of the proposed Opportunities for Giving in the amount of \$18,000 for the period February 1, 2013 to September 30, 2013 as presented.
- 11. Minutes of July 8, 2011.

 Lois Mierau/Janet Buhler moved/seconded the adoption of the July 8, 2011 annual meeting minutes as printed in the Annual Report Book. Carried.
- 12. Worship Singing. The Worship Team led us in singing Will you let me be your Servant and Days of Elijah.
- 13. Introduction of 2012 Bible Study Guide. Amy Gingerich from MennoMedia was not able to attend so Melissa Miller, chair of the MennoMedia bi-national board, introduced the 2012 Bible Study Guide, Let Justice Roll Down written by Rebecca Seiling and based on the book of Amos.
- 14. **Mennonite Girls Can Cook Presentation.** Lovella Schellenberg shared about the MGCC journey and the project they support in the Ukraine. She reflected on the verses from 1 Peter 4:8-11. Eight of the 10 authors were able to attend and autographed copies of the cookbook, which were for sale.
- 15. **Door Prizes and "Guess the Seeds" Game.** During the luncheon, a number of names were drawn for door prizes which were provided by the executive. There were also small packets of seeds on the tables, which women could try to identify and prizes were awarded to each guest at the table that correctly guessed all the seeds. Only one table identified all of the seeds, including the mystery seed!
- 16. Closing. Karen Martens-Zimmerly closed with prayer and the Worship Team led in a closing song, *Let Your Glory Fall.* We adjourned at 3:20 pm.

CONSTITUTION MENNONITE WOMEN CANADA Proposed Changes July 2014

MOTTO: "As each has received a gift, employ it for one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." 1 Peter 4:10

1. NAME

"Mennonite Women Canada" (A partner with Mennonite Church Canada)

2. MISSION STATEMENT

Mennonite Women Canada encourages women to:

- nurture their life in Christ
- acknowledge and share their gifts
- hear and support each other
- serve and minister across the street and around the world.

We commit ourselves to:

- a) Promote spiritual growth through Bible study, prayer, other Christian disciplines and fellowship.
- b) Discern and nurture women's gifts and skills for leadership and service in the local church, the community and the world.
- c) Build relationships and networks for support, affirmation, discernment, witness, service and celebration.
- d) Support and strengthen the missional outreach of Mennonite Church Canada.

3. MEMBERSHIP

All women who participate in a Mennonite Church Canada congregation are welcome.

4. EXECUTIVE

- a) The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, President Elect, Secretary-Treasurer, and Leaders of provincial/regional women's organizations or Area Church women's ministries. The Executive Committee may appoint a representative in consultation with the Area Church when there is no provincial/regional member organization or women's ministry.
- b) The President and the Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected by-ballot at the annual conference a biennial assembly for a three two year term. They can serve a maximum of two three consecutive terms.
- c) A President Elect shall be elected by-ballot for a one year term, prior to the President completing her term in order to work along side her for one year before becoming President.

5. COMMITTEES

- a) PROGRAM COMMITTEE shall be made up of
 - President
 - Provincial President from the province where the next assembly is to be held.
- b) FINANCE COMMITTEE shall be made up of
 - Secretary-Treasurer
 - President

b) NOMINATING COMMITTEE shall be made up of

- Provincial Presidents
- Committee chairperson shall be the President of the province in which the next assembly will be held.
- Nominees must be active members in a Mennonite Church Canada congregation.
- c) The Executive Committee shall appoint special committees whenever the need arises.

6. ANNUAL MEETING

A. TIME

The annual biennial meeting shall be held in conjunction with the biennial sessions of the Mennonite Church Canada Assembly. In the off-year, when there is no MC Canada Assembly scheduled, the MW Canada executive (which meets annually at Spring Leadership Assembly in March) has the authority to present and approve the financial statements including the budget.

B. VOTING

Anyone present at the **annual** *biennial* meeting and a member/adherent of a Mennonite Church Canada congregation or participant in a Mennonite women's provincial/regional organization has voting privileges.

C. BUSINESS

The annual biennial business meeting must include the following agenda items:

- Adoption of the minutes
- Adoption of the financial report
- President's report
- Elections
- Other business

7. CHANGE OF CONSTITUTION

- a) A request for changes to the constitution must be submitted to the secretary four months prior to the annual biennial meeting. She will then send a copy of the proposed changes to the provincial/regional presidents or representatives for distribution.
- b) Any changes in the constitution must be approved by a two-thirds majority of votes cast at the **annual** *biennial* meeting.
